BOOKING is now open for our 2024 Conference **SEND MY ROOTS RAIN**, led by keynote speaker Christopher Chapman and liturgist Avril Baigent.

SEND MY ROOTS RAIN will take place at **NODDFA SPIRITUALITY CENTRE.** We have booked the whole centre for the Conference. Noddfa is a beautiful house with a warm welcome! The ground floor has very large shared sitting rooms – including a library and conference room as well as the lovely hall, comfortable dining room and peaceful chapel. There are 2 labyrinths and a fountain in the extensive grounds that blend into the surrounding fields and countryside. Walks go up one way into the hills of Snowdonia or down the other way to the sea! But there is plenty of scope for walking around the house and garden too or curling up with the resident cat(s). Do take advantage of the early bird booking and let us know of any special needs. Most of the bedrooms are on the first floor, some are in the annexe and in a separate house called Shalom in the grounds. There is a stairlift to the main house rooms.
